Round House Theatre is very excited to be in residence at Cabin John Middle School this school year, and to work with your students! Please take a few minutes to look over the information included here.

AUDITIONS/INTERVIEWS:

Round House will be auditioning students for the cast on Tuesday, Jan 21 and Thursday, Jan 23. Students should plan on attending both days. They do not need to prepare anything for auditions – all material will be provided on Tuesday.

Students interested in being part of the crew should plan on attending crew interviews on Wednesday, Jan 22.

Students and parents will be notified of casting no later than Tuesday, January 28th via email, using the contact information provided in the online contact form. All email communication from Round House Theatre Education will include students and parents.

THE PROGRAM:

A Round House Theatre Production Residency is designed to take students at every level and prepare them to create and perform in a final production as actors and designers/crew. We take a multidisciplinary approach to theatre – teaching acting, movement, design and playmaking. Students are guided and taught by RHT teaching artists, who are accomplished teachers and are working professionally as theatre artists. The residency seeks to inspire, teach, guide, and support young theatre artists in the play-making process, as well as encouraging the development of critical life skills including time management, creativity, communication and collaboration.

PARENTS – Our goal is to make sure that every student has a great time exploring the art form of theatre. Our approach is very ensemble-based to ensure that every student is engaged during the process. That said, we know that the casting process in particular can be stressful, and with ensemble productions, it is not always immediately clear how much of the show the student may be involved in. We will welcome as many students into the cast as possible, while still giving the students a good experience – and are experts at developing those ensemble moments that allow students to shine.

THE SHOW:

Disney's Frozen JR

The enchanting modern classic from Disney is ready for your Broadway Junior stars! *Frozen JR*. is based on the 2018 Broadway musical, and brings Elsa, Anna, and the magical land of Arendelle to life, onstage. The show features all of the memorable songs from the animated film, with music and lyrics by Kristen Anderson-Lopez and Robert Lopez, plus five new songs written for the Broadway production.

THE TIME COMMITMENT:

Rehearsals will generally take place Tuesday & Thursday afternoons between 3 and 4:25.A schedule of the full process is included at the end of this document. After rehearsals begin, we will do our best to make good use of your student's time, and let you know a week in advance what students are called on any given rehearsal day. (In other words, we won't add dates, but we may not call all students on every day of rehearsal) We encourage students to bring their homework or other reading in case they have downtime during rehearsals.

Crew calls will take place on Wednesday afternoons between 3 and 4:325.

Performances, and the tech rehearsals in the week leading up to the performance are required for all cast and crew.

Students will be asked to share any known conflicts when they audition/apply. While we know unforeseen circumstances arise, it's very helpful for our teaching artists to know about absences in advance, so please make sure we are aware of any planned absences. A full schedule is included at the end of this document.

OTHER COMMITMENTS:

Participation in the company requires that students:

- Complete and return any paperwork in a timely fashion.
- Attend rehearsals, crew calls and activities as called
- Do required preparation outside of rehearsals/company calls
- Come ready to contribute and participate. Be present and focused.
- Commit to their role in the company and to the program as a whole.

Student artists are expected to follow the RHT Education Department Code of Conduct which includes the following:

- I will show respect to other artists and staff and treat them, as I would like to be treated. I will show respect for the rights and beliefs of others, cooperate with instructions, and treat all ensemble members with courtesy and consideration.
- I will appreciate my fellow participants as artists. I will not make-fun of anyone's artistic ability or purposefully damage another participant's work.
- I will communicate in an appropriate manner, including refraining from foul language, gestures, harsh words or tone of
 voice.
- I will refrain from causing bodily harm to others.
- I will use program equipment, supplies, and facilities properly, including cleaning up after myself.
- I will respect the property of others.
- Offenses which will result in an immediate dismissal from the company include: sexual misconduct, fighting, taking or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs during any activity, possessing weapons, profanity or abusive language towards another artist or staff member.

YOUR PRIMARY TEACHING ARTISTS:

Desiree Chapelle received her MFA in Acting from The Catholic University of America, a BA in Drama from Trinity University, and has studied at the Gaiety School of Acting in Dublin, Ireland. Desiree is a Linklater Teacher-Trainee – training to become a Linklater voice teacher. Prior to graduate school, she worked for two years as a middle school drama teacher, and then served two years as the Theatre Arts Director at Devine HS near San Antonio, TX. She has performed in We Happy Few's *Macbeth*, Rorschach Theatre Company's *Sing To Me Now*, and she premiered *Cold Rain* at the 2018 DC Capital Fringe Festival. Favorite CUA credits include: *Macbeth*, *The Love of the Nightingale*, *Bloody Poetry*, and *Pride and Prejudice*. Favorite Texas credits include: Sheldon Vexler Theatre (*The 39 Steps*) and The Classic Theatre of San Antonio (*Six Degrees of Separation*).

Claire Jones is a dance and theatre instructor who loves sharing her passion for the arts with students in a respectful, fun, and encouraging way. She holds a Major in Dance and minor in Theatre from University of Maryland, Baltimore County with previous training at Maryland Youth Ballet and Montgomery College. Her performance credits include dancing with several companies such as ClancyWorks, Movieus Contemporary Ballet, and Bowen McCauley Dance. She has also performed at Olney Theatre Center and at the Waterside Theatre for two seasons with the company of The Lost Colony in Manteo, NC. She has taught dance and theatre for The Drama Learning Center, The Bullis Summer Specialty camps, Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery County Department of Recreation, and Roundhouse Theatre Education. She has also been choreographing shows for 9 years, some of her favorites being *Thoroughly Modern Millie* and *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers*.
