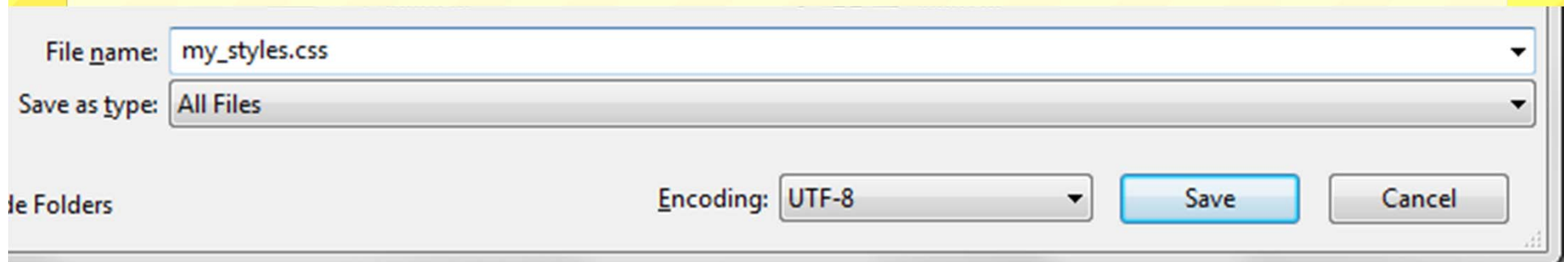

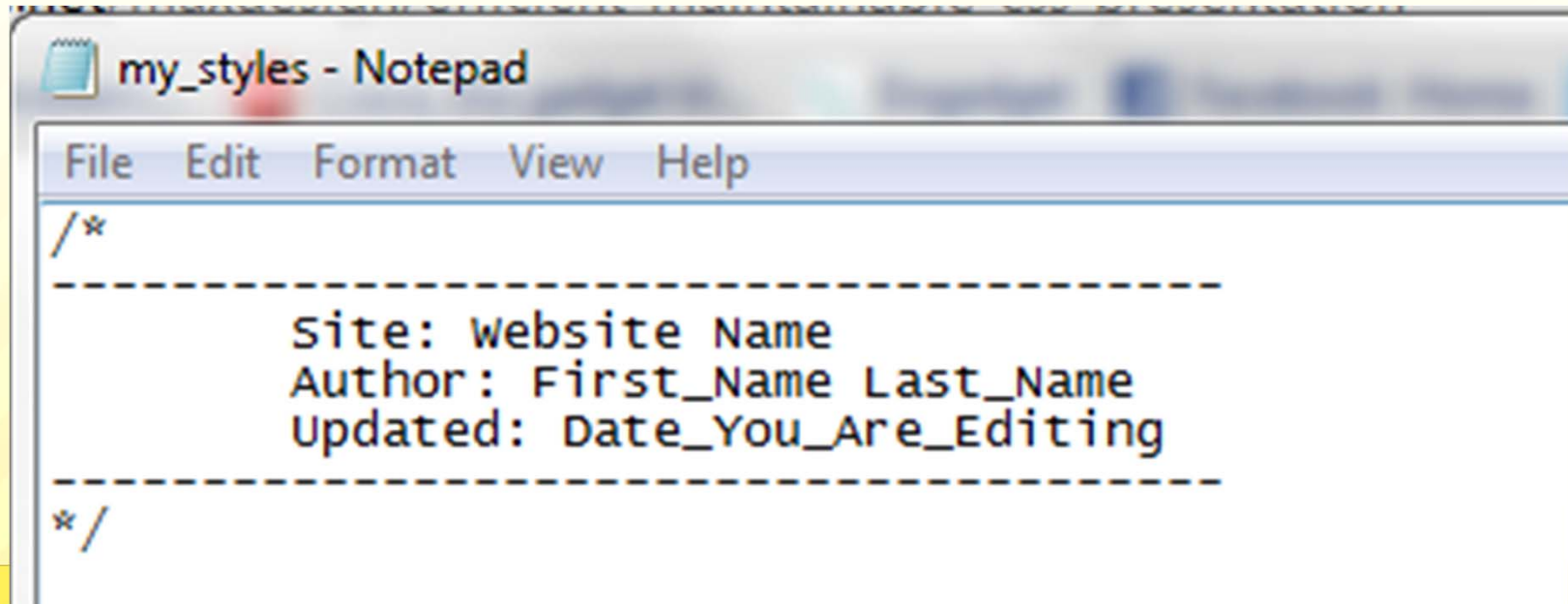
Create an External CSS File

- Create a file with extension .css
- Careful to save to it keeps this extension



Start with a Comment

- Comment: does not affect how computer “runs” the code
- Write a CSS comment by surrounding text with `/*` and `*/`
- Label top of your code with basic info

Link Style Sheet to HTML

- Add into <head> section
- <link> tag
- rel → always value "stylesheet"
- href → file name of stylesheet
- type → always value "text/css"
