### Ms. Rice's Counseling Update

Spring is a time of renewal and change. The grass is greener, the flowers are blooming, kittens are being born, and your child is growing. With growth comes change and transition which can be hard.

The end of the school year is fast approaching. Students have all sorts of feelings when school is coming to a close because school can be something different to every student. For many it's a place to be enlightened and learn, for others it is where they are able to be most social, and for some it is a safe haven. As students anticipate the end of the year, they begin to recognize what they will gain or lose over the summer and this is what brings on the feelings.

It's quite hot in my office and I've been sitting in cooler, yet also more communal, spaces while I write this. In perfect timing for this article, I had the benefit of overhearing a student express her discontent with a middle school boundary, "I can't wait to leave this place," she said. Some of our 8th graders are feeling exactly that way right now, they just can't wait to move on to high school and have more freedom. Some are bursting with excitement at the opportunities that lie ahead. Yet, others may be feeling a little apprehensive, nostalgic, or unsure. After all, this is the place where they began their journey through adolescence.

So many feelings accompany the transition from school year to summer that we start seeing them emerge right after spring break. Different students handle transition in different ways, and for some the transition is harder than for others. If you have an 8th grader, they are going to high school. Can you believe it! Have you talked with them about how they are feeling during this time of transition? I have had the pleasure of hosting my first intern this spring and she too is in a time of transition. While she's excited to graduate and start

working, she's also feeling kind of blue, because for the first time in her life she won't be a student.

No matter how old your child is, whether they are transitioning to 7th grade or high school, they are still learning how to manage big emotions and may need your support at this time. As I've said before, the best thing you can do as a parent is connect with your child. Validate their emotions and all of the feelings they are feeling. It's totally normal to feel excited, nervous, done with middle school, not quite ready to leave, and everything in between. After you validate their feelings, encourage your child to finish the year strong, to continue to put in the effort, and to continue to show up and show respect to themselves, the teachers, and staff. It's important to finish what you start, and while it's easy to mentally check out at this time of year, school is still in session.

Good luck with the transition and remember, change is hard, but it also can be good.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

**TO REPORT AN ABSENCE** Call the Attendance Line at 240-740-2101 by 9 a.m. or send an excuse note by email.

Upon return to school, send a note to the main office: include the student's full name, grade, dates, and reason for absence. You can use this <u>Attendance Note</u> template for Absences, Tardies, or Early Dismissals. MCPS requires a doctor's note for absences of 5 days or more. For an absence of 3 days or longer, homework may be requested by calling the Counseling Office at 240-740-2110.

Teachers enter attendance for each period into Synergy, the attendance system. All class absences generate an automated call/email to parents. If you believe there is an error, please contact the teacher and the attendance office.

#### **CAFETERIA FEES**

It may be necessary to periodically review the cafeteria balance and funding source on your student's account to check for accuracy and for appropriate monetary funds. As a reminder, a traditional school lunch is \$2.80, but students have the option to purchase additional a la carte items for additional purchase. We find it appropriate for you to review with your child expectations and norms around cafeteria spending, and to support them in establishing boundaries and budgeting accordingly. We do not want any surprises for you and your child in terms of their daily spending. #### FREE and REDUCED MEALS

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for meals.

  may apply for meal benefits at any time during the school year.
