Ms. Rice's Counseling Update

Close your eyes and imagine the smell of freshly baked cookies in your house. Yum, right? Now, close your eyes and imagine driving car pool after a soccer game and everyone has taken their shoes off. It's an assault on your senses, right?

The changing hormones of puberty stimulate glands and increase perspiration, especially in the underarm and groin areas. The increase in perspiration combined with bacteria that live on the skin create an odor. This odor is affectionately known as B.O. We've all noticed our own children, maybe Febreezed their bedroom when they were off at school, but imagine being in the middle of thirty sweaty pubescent adolescents?

It's natural that teens sweat more and they sweat in new places on their bodies. The oils produced in the underarm and groin sweat glands, along with the different chemicals found in teen sweat, mixing with the bacteria living on our skin and clothing can create a very strong odor. At this age, it's important to bathe or shower daily, paying particular attention to the armpit and groin area. Some teens may need antibacterial soap, but all could use some deodorant. It's also a good idea to wash clothes regularly and avoid wearing the same thing multiple days in a row.

As much as I sometimes want to walk the hallways handing out deodorant samples, it's a delicate conversation that is best to have at home. If you haven't had the talk already, keep

Upon return to school, send a note to the main office: include the student's full name, grade, dates, and reason for absence. You can use this <u>Attendance Note</u> template for Absences, Tardies, or Early Dismissals. MCPS requires a doctor's note for absences of 5 days or more. For an absence of 3 days or longer, homework may be requested by calling the Counseling Office at 240-740-2110.

Teachers enter attendance for each period into Synergy, the attendance system. All class absences generate an automated call/email to parents. If you believe there is an error, please contact the teacher and the attendance office.

CAFETERIA FEES

It may be necessary to periodically review the cafeteria balance and funding source on your student's account to check for accuracy and for appropriate monetary funds. We find it appropriate for you to review with your child expectations and norms around cafeteria spending, and to support them in establishing boundaries and budgeting accordingly. We do not want any surprises for you and your child in terms of their daily spending. FREE and REDUCED MEALS

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for meals. Applications: Free and Reduced-price Meals System (FARMS) applications have been updated for the new school year and are now available online at <u>www.MySchoolApps.com</u>; this is the preferred application method.

- Federal eligibility guidelines change each school year; therefore, a new application must be submitted each school year. All students in the family should be listed on one household application.
