Dear North Bethesda Families:

This week our students worked hard to complete the MAP R and MAP M assessments. Next week, Social Studies MCAP will be administered to eighth graders through social studies classes.

I have spoken about this before but I am asking again for your support in addressing the recent "Chromebook challenge" with your children. A recent trend known as the "TikTok Chromebook Challenge" encourages students to misuse or intentionally damage school-issued Chromebooks. This "Chromebook Challenge" encourages students to purposefully cause their devices to short out or catch fire by inserting metal or lead into the charging or USB port, or even piercing the device's battery.

Please remind them that:

- Our school-issued Chromebooks are not just devices, they are valuable educational tools that significantly contribute to their learning. It's crucial that they are handled with care and respect.
- Participating in harmful social media challenges is unsafe and may carry serious consequences. Respect for school property, peers, and learning spaces is not just an individual responsibility but a shared expectation that we all must uphold.

 All Chromebook damage will be thoroughly investigated, and appropriate consequences will be assigned in accordance with the MCPS Student Code of Conduct. Please also note that families may be responsible for the repair or replacement costs for student-issued devices that are deliberately damaged.

We appreciate your help as we work together to encourage safe, responsible, and respectful behavior both in and outside the classroom for our students. We have already had to issue disciplinary consequences and in one case, a family is paying for a Chromebook because their child irreparably damaged it by partaking in the Chromebook challenge.

Ms. Rice's Counseling Update

"What's going on over there?" "Wait, is that what I think it is?" "Where?" "Come on, let's go see!" "It's a fight." "Oh, this is going to be good..." "F-I-G-H-T!"

These are some natural middle school age student reactions to conflict. Students want to get in on the action and watching it makes them a part of things. Recording it gives them even bigger credit because they can show others later. These are the actions of a bystander, but we want our students to be upstanders.

An upstander is a person who speaks up or acts on behalf of a cause or another person, someone who finds a way to intervene. A bystander is just present in the moment and while they may think they aren't taking any part in the action, by standing there doing nothing, or just whooping and hollering on the sidelines, these actions are saying, I'm on board with this and I'm okay with this happening.

Recently there was a fight outside at lunch time, and for the first time all year students pulled out their phones to video. When students video a fight they prolong the conflict and the drama surrounding the conflict. Conflict occurs, in school, in homes, in life. We want to teach our children how to handle conflict in healthy ways, how to defuse conflict, and move on quickly from conflict. I was asked for some tips, so here goes. I hope you'll use these talking points to have a healthy conversation with your child(ren.)

- When you hear about conflict brewing, tell an adult. When adults in the school building are notified in advance of a conflict, we can step in to defuse the situation before a fight occurs. There are many ways to notify an adult - tell the teacher in your class, ask to see an administrator or counselor, tell security when they walk by you in the hallway, put a note in the "request to see your counselor" form.
- 2. If you see a fight break out, move away and tell an adult. By moving away you are signaling that you are not going to stand by and let this happen and you are helping to de-escalate the fight. When a crowd gathers to watch, fights often intensify

because those fighting feel they have to prove something to the crowd. By telling an adult you are trying to help intervene before things get worse.

- **3.** Many middle school conflicts are verbal, just an exchange of unpleasant comments.
 - a. You can try to pull a friend away from the interaction.
 - b. You can remind your friends (if those fighting are friends) why they are friends.
 - c. Whatever you do, don't join the verbal exchange with the intention of defending your pal this pulls you into the fight too.
- 4. When fights are physical, don't try to break the fight up with your own voice or **body.** This is a good time to tell an adult before things get worse.
- 5. As enticing as it may be, **don't record a fight**. While videoing in a public place is not a violation of the law, distributing the video can be, especially if it's proven that the distribution was with malicious intent. Besides, if it were you, would you want to be recorded for the world to see? Remember that when we record, the evidence is out there, forever.
- 6. Read some more <u>tips from Kaiser Permanente</u> on violence at school, how to handle things, and how to feel safe.

While the content of this newsletter may be about verbal and physical conflict, please remember that overall school is a safe place. We have numerous protocols established to manage a large number of students and violence. However, conflict is a part of life and tends to happen when there are adolescents who are still learning how to make good choices and decisions. Hopefully we learn as we age better ways to manage conflict when it's brewing, whether within ourselves or others. May these tips serve as talking points you can use to begin or deepen the conversation with your adolescent.
