## IMPORTANT COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION

1. Each student must enroll in the equivalent of **seven** classes, one for each of the periods in our daily schedule.
  - a. If a student enrolls in a high school credit class, be sure to register on-line for both the A (semester 1) and B (semester 2) sections of the course. This would mean 8 courses were selected.
  - b. If a student enrolls in two semester long electives (to equal a full year) and a high school credit class, then they may show as being registered for nine classes.
2. Course recommendations can be found in the on-line scheduling program. Click the content area. When the chart comes up showing the course options, click at the top of the "Alerts" column on the far right. All recommended courses should move to the top for easy viewing. These recommendations are tentative pending final performance and assessments from 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
3. Investigations into Science 6, Historical Inquiries in World Studies 6, ADV English 6, and Physical Education 6/Health 6, have already been selected as each student will automatically be enrolled in these courses. Adjustments will be made later if students need to participate in support, ESOL, or Special Education classes.
4. The elective selections are for the full year. Please indicate your student's 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> choices on the registration card and only register for their 1<sup>st</sup> choice on line. We do our best to honor first choices. However, if there is a schedule conflict we will work to enroll students in their second choice.
5. Students who enroll in a high school credit course are expected to maintain an A or B average in that course.
6. Students enrolled in a World Language or Algebra will earn high school credit if all criteria are met.
7. **New Information Regarding High School Credit Courses taken in Middle School** per MCPS Regulation IKC-RA, *Grade Point Averages (GPA) and Weighted Grade Point Averages (WGPA)*:

*"Beginning with students entering middle school in the 2018-2019 school year, grades and credit earned for high school courses taken in middle school will continue to be included on the high school transcript, but the grade points will not be automatically calculated into the cumulative GPA unless requested by students or parents/guardians."*
