IMPORTANT COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION

- 1. Each student must enroll in the equivalent of <u>seven</u> classes, one for each of the periods in our daily schedule.
 - a. If a student does not enroll in a full year elective course, then they must choose one of the elective pairings comprised of two-one semester courses. This would mean 8 courses will be selected.
 - b. If a student enrolls in a high school credit class, be sure to register on-line for both the A (semester 1) and B (semester 2) sections of the course. This would mean 8 courses were selected.
 - c. If a student enrolls in two semester long electives (to equal a full year) and a high school credit class, then they may show as being registered for nine classes.
- 2. Course recommendations can be found in the on-line scheduling program. Click the content area. When the chart comes up showing the course options, click at the top of the "Alerts" column on the far right. All recommended courses should move to the top for easy viewing. These recommendations are tentative pending final performance and assessments from 6th grade.
- **3.** Students who enroll in a high school credit course are expected to maintain an A or B average in that course.
- **4.** Investigations into Science 7, ADV World Studies 7, ADV English 7, and Health/Physical Education 7, have already been selected as each student will automatically be enrolled in these courses.
- 5. The elective selections are for the full year unless labelled otherwise. Please indicate your student's 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices on the registration card and only register for their 1st choice on line. We do our best to honor first choices. However, if there is a schedule conflict we will work to enroll students in their second choice.
- 6. Students enrolled in a World Language or Algebra will earn a high school credit if all criteria are met.
- 7. Chinese 1A/B and Chinese 2A/B will most likely be held at BCC High School during period 1. As student enrollment and staffing allocation determine whether these courses can be held at SCMS, we have already established a partnership with BCC-HS so that we can offer Chinese 1A/B and 2A/B regardless. Transportation will be provided to transport SCMS students to and from BCC-HS.
