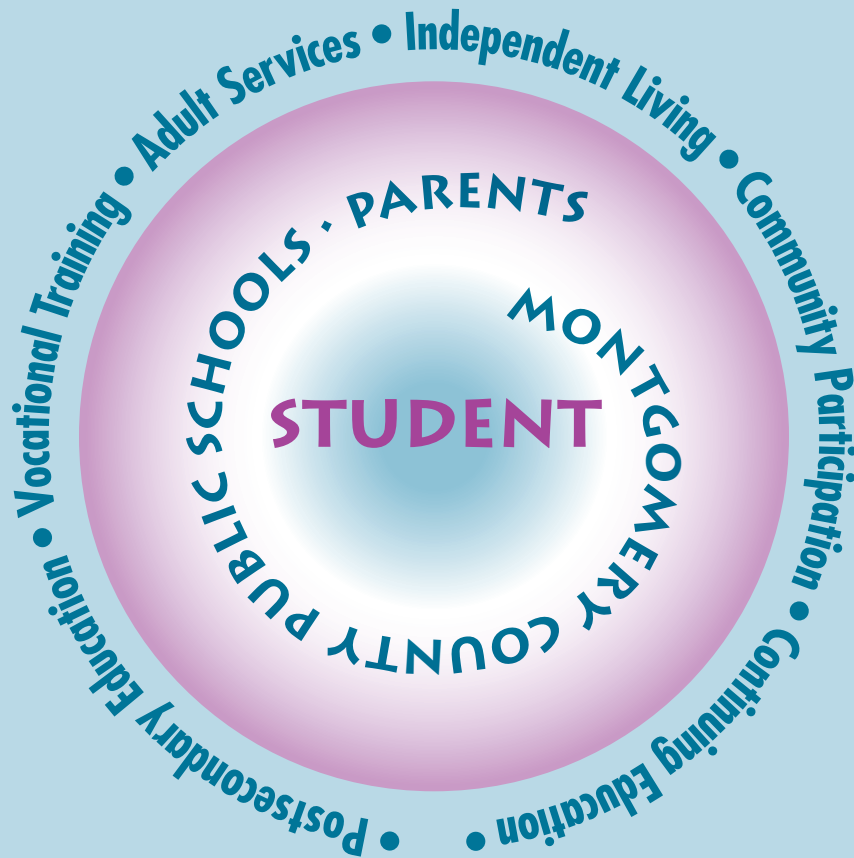
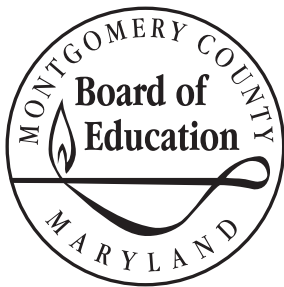

USING THIS BOOKLET

The *Transition Connection* booklet is developed as a service to Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) students with disabilities and their families. Information on both public and private agencies is included. These agencies are not affiliated with MCPS. These agencies are listed in alphabetical order under each category.

PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION & RECORDS

Applicants must bring a social security card plus one other form of identification, such as an original or certified birth certificate, military discharge papers, valid passport, or naturalization papers. Also, applicants must provide two proof-of-residence documents, such as a utility bill with name and address. If the proof of residence is in the parent's name, the parent or guardian should accompany the individual and bring his or her own ID or license along with the proof-of-residence documents.

School records may be needed to verify eligibility for services as an adult. Records are kept at schools for five years after graduation and can be obtained from the school registrar. At the end of that time, some records are sent to MCPS Central Records to be put on microfilm. These records may be obtained by contacting MCPS Central Records, 301-320-7301. Psychological reports are available from the Department of Student Services, 301-279-3805. If the student is over the age of 18, the psychological report will be available through MCPS Central Records, 301-320-7301.
