

Anthony Richard Tilghman Memorial Scholarship Trust

Prior to her death in 1983, R. Cecilia Cooke Tilghman requested that a scholarship fund be established in the name of her mentally impaired son, Anthony Richard Tilghman. This Fund is established according to her directive.

Established in 1993 by Cyprian and Cecilia Tilghman in memory of their son, Anthony Richard, to aid any Washington area graduate student in furthering a career in the education and care of the mentally disabled or to aid the career development of a mentally disabled student.

Anthony Richard Tilghman, 1944 - 1983, spent the majority of his life in institutions for the mentally impaired. He died in such an institution. The purpose of this scholarship, up to \$5,000, is to help improve the quality of the education and care of the mentally disabled in either the public or private sector.

Please include with your application:

1. A certified copy of your current High School transcript
2. Two letters of recommendation
3. An essay (500 words or less) telling how you plan to help the disabled or, if you are mentally disabled, how you plan to develop your career.

Optional: You may include one paragraph of information that you feel will help us in our decision. Additionally, you may use one side of an additional sheet to complete your application form.
