

MCPS Athletics Statement – Impact of COVID-19 on Operations July 21, 2020

Today, July 21, 2020, Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS), after careful review and consultation with the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services, announced the cancellation of the fall and winter sport seasons during the 2020–2021 school year due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, these two seasons will not occur as they have traditionally been conducted. For MCPS, this includes all varsity and junior varsity sports at the high school level, along with our middle school athletics program.

While we are deeply saddened by the cancellation of interscholastic athletics during this time, we know that the number one priority for everyone is the health and safety of our students and staff. In this regard, we appreciate the ongoing efforts of student-athletes, coaches, athletics specialists, athletic coordinators, and all stakeholders across our program to embrace and champion physical distancing and safe practices.
