The Open/ Closed list will be published weekly to provide information about the content areas/fields, levels, hours, and programs that are open or closed for internal teacher transfers.

This information is based on the number of involuntary transfers by content area, level, and FTE compared to the number of vacancies by content area, level, FTE, and other program needs.

- The chart below provides information about which content areas are available for teachers to be considered and recommended for hire in fields they are not currently teaching.
- A field that is *Open* means that a teacher who is not currently teaching in that field can be considered for hire.
- A field that is *Closed* means that only teachers who are currently teaching in that field can be considered for hire.

Status of Levels Open or Closed for Voluntary Transfers

- MCPS teachers currently in an elementary school can be considered, and recommended for hire for positions in a middle or high school where the content area is Open.
- MCPS teachers currently in a middle or high school can be considered or recommended for hire for positions in elementary school.

Status of Programs Open or Closed for Voluntary Transfers

- MCPS teachers regardless of what level they are currently teaching can be considered and recommended for hire for positions at elementary language immersion schools.

Status of Physical Education, Art, Music, ESOL, Special Education, World Languages, and Media Specialist Voluntary Transfers Moving Levels

- Current MCPS physical education, art, music, ESOL, special education, and world language teachers, as well as media specialist can be considered and recommended for hire for physical education, art, music, ESOL, special education and world language teacher, and media specialist positions at all levels, elementary, middle, and high school. These employees must be certified and currently working in these areas.

Status of Full-Time and Part-Time Open or Closed for Voluntary Transfers

- MCPS teachers who are full-time can become part-time in all content areas.
- Full-time teachers are able to be considered and recommended for hire for part-time positions in all content areas.
- MCPS teachers who are part-time can become full-time at this time. Part-time teachers are able to be considered and recommended for hire for full-time positions.
