



RE: CVS/Caremark Prescription Plan for Retirees
and/or Dependents on Medicare

Dear Retiree:

All retirees and dependents covered by Medicare Parts A & B and the CVS/Caremark Prescription Drug Plan will have the same drug benefits as prior to Medicare enrollment with the exception of diabetic supplies and Medicare Part B-eligible drugs. Medicare Part B covers diabetic supplies and certain specialty drugs. Filing claims for diabetic supplies and Medicare Part B-eligible drugs with Medicare reduces costs for MCPS and helps to lower premiums for all participants.

When you order either diabetic supplies or Medicare Part B-eligible drugs through CVS/Caremark, CVS/Caremark will send you the CVS/Caremark *Participant Agreement Assignment of Benefits (AOB)* form. In order to receive your drugs in a timely fashion, it is important that you complete and return to the form to CVS/Caremark. **Failure to return the completed CVS/Caremark *Participant Agreement Assignment of Benefits (AOB)* form to CVS/Caremark will delay filling of diabetic supplies and other Medicare Part B-eligible drugs.**

Details regarding Medicare, CVS/Caremark, diabetic supplies, and Medicare Part B-eligible drugs is available in the MCPS *Retiree Benefit Summary*. Each spring, the MCPS *Retiree Benefit Summary* is mailed to all MCPS retirees.
