



Possible Future Transitions to Virtual Learning

MCPS leadership in consultation with the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and individual school leaders will examine schools on a case-by-case basis and determine whether a school needs to transition to virtual learning for a designated period of time for health and operational reasons.

Multiple factors will be considered to inform a decision for an individual school to transition to virtual learning.

Those factors include:



Data gathered about:



Positive case rates
for students and staff



Student
absences



Staff
absences



Unserved
bus routes



Unfilled
substitute requests

(Note: the numbers associated with these data points will be examined for trends over time and higher averages. No one data point is considered as a threshold for decision-making. Information examined for an individual school is school-specific and needs to be considered in that manner).

School leadership assessment of operational readiness, and



Any Impacts to school specific programs.
