Request to Withhold Directory Information

In compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), students will receive form 281-13 — Annual Notice for Directory Information and Student Privacy, in their homeroom packet. This form contains a section where parents/ guardians may Request to Withhold Directory Information for the 2018-2019 School Year. If parents/guardians choose to withhold certain information (e.g., name, telephone, photo) or even all information, they will have the opportunity to indicate exceptions to release that information for the PTA Directory, for Honor Roll publication, and for the yearbook. It is very important that, if you wish to have your child's name and/or photo appear in the yearbook, you check the Release photo for yearbook box. We cannot include your child's name and/or photo, individual or as part of a group, in the yearbook without this exception being noted in writing.

In addition, if you have chosen to withhold information but would like your child to be recognized for achievements in the *Paw Prints* and on the Baker website, **please make sure to check** the Release name and photo for Baker *Paw Prints* and Baker website box.

If you do not wish to withhold any directory information, you do not need to turn in this form. If you do wish to withhold directory info, please return the form by September 14, 2018. If you have any questions, please email Ms. Lawrowycz at Romana Z Lawrowycz@mcpsmd.org.
