Special Programs at Clarksburg High School

► **The Advanced Placement Power Scholars (APPS) Program** is a *Signature Program of Clarksburg High School*. It is designed as a four-year college preparatory course of study through which students follow a comprehensive curriculum combining honors level and advanced placement course work. Students receive structured support and skill refinement through their course work and periodic group meetings. It is the most rigorous academic program offered at Clarksburg High School. It culminates with a capstone project, internship, or the completion of at least 7 AP/dual enrollment classes. There is an application process for admission to the APPS program.

► **Pathways in Technology in Network and Information Technology (P-Tech)** is a new program of Clarksburg High School. It is a dual enrollment program that enables participating students to earn both a high school diploma from Clarksburg High School and an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree from Montgomery College while in high school. The AAS degree ensures students meet industry expectations, gain technical skills and workplace competencies as well as industry certifications. This program offers students mentoring, internship, and paid summer employment opportunities within the technical industry in Montgomery County.
