She attended University of Maryland, College Park, and graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor of Science in elementary education. In 1998, she graduated with a Masters of Education in School Administration and Supervision from Johns Hopkins University. She is special education certified.

Ms. Leaman's teaching experience began in 1994 as a Prince George's County Public Schools 6th, 7th and 8th grade mathematics teacher at Greenbelt Middle School where she also served as school testing coordinator. In 1998, Ms. Leaman moved to Southern Middle School in Calvert County Public Schools where she continued to teach 6th and 7th grade mathematics and coordinated the Saturday School Program. In 2000, Ms. Leaman was appointed assistant principal in Southern Middle School. As an assistant principal, she gained valuable experience as special education chairperson and resumed her role as school testing coordinator. In 2004, she moved on to Calvert High School where she supervised the Freshman Academy and Student Services Team and continued as special education coordinator. Ms. Leaman also served as assistant principal in Anne Arundel County Public Schools from 2005-2008 and Kent County Public Schools (KCPS) from 2008-2009. Ms. Leaman was appointed KCPS Judy Center Coordinator and Elementary Supervisor prior to moving to Frederick County Public Schools (FCPS) in 2009 as an assistant principal. In FCPS, Ms. Leaman served in the roles of professional development coordinator, PBIS committee chairperson and coach and supervised special education and English Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). She was appointed Acting Principal at Windsor Knolls Middle School from July 2014 – January 2015 and wrote and was awarded a three-year Minority Achievement Grant for summer, Saturday and after school student instruction for incoming at-risk middle school students. Ms. Leaman served on the Frederick County Discipline Review Committee for three years; one as tri-chair. She was a member of the Frederick County Administrative and Supervisory Association Board of Directors.

Ms. Leaman joined Montgomery County Public Schools in 2016 as an Assistant School Administrator (ASA). During assignments at Albert Einstein High School, Clarksburg High School and Wheaton High School (WHS), she supervised Art, Business, ESOL, Music, Physical Education, Science, Special Education and World Language. She continued to serve as school testing coordinator until 2018. Ms. Leaman was grade level co-administrator for the WHS Ninth Grade Academy class of 2022. She was awarded the WHS Distinguished Knight Award for her work with Ninth Grade Academy and special education resource reprogramming.

Ms. Leaman joined the administrative team at Walter Johnson High School on July 1, 2019. She will supervise Physical Education and World Language. She will return to her role of lead school testing coordinator and continue her role as grade level co-administrator for the incoming ninth-grade class of 2023.
