Writing is an essential skill that develops at different rates in each child. It is more than putting words to paper, it is a communication process that plays an important role in your child's life. In order for your children to become skillful writers, it is important that parents and teachers work together. Be aware of the writing instruction occurring in school. Be patient as your child writes. We foster the understanding that ideas are more important than spelling and/or grammar. Support can be in conversations about their ideas to help them discover what they want to say. Consider creating a conducive environment for your child to write and encourage them to write frequently while you praise their efforts. Together we can support IB Communicators who see writing as a tool for learning.

- Write letters and postcards
- Send emails
- Keep a journal
- Write in a travel log when taking a trip or vacation
- Use shopping lists
- Read, read, and read!
