Tips & Tools for Applying & Accepting Financial Aid in the State of Maryland ● FAQ's ● The Maryland College Aid Processing System (MD CAPS) accounts for accepting financial aid. Set up the MD CAPS account using this link. Complete the FAFSA (check individual college deadlines for priority date due). Check your MD CAPS account on a regular basis after filing the FAFSA. Complete all items on the checklist. Links and forms for documents required will be available to download in your MD CAPS account.

For all applicant <u>eligibility requirements</u>, including how to sign up for a <u>MDCAPS account</u> can be found on the MHEC website. If you have questions, call the Office of Student Financial Assistance at 410-767-3300 and follow the prompt to press #1. You can also meet <u>virtually with a financial aid specialist</u> to talk more about your options when applying for financial aid to achieve your higher education goals.

RESOURCE: The Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship is available each academic year to students who enroll at a Maryland community college. The Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship is a last dollar award, available to students who plan to enroll in credit-bearing coursework leading to a vocational certificate, certificate, or an associate degree. All interested applicants must submit either the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the MHEC One-App each year.

If you are applying to UMD College Park and demonstrate qualities like leadership, being service oriented, committed to striving to be best and perseverance, you may want to learn more about IAP.

UPDATE 1/31/2024: Due to the late changes to the FAFSA, the UMD priority deadline has been extended until March 1. This later deadline directly impacts us as we rely on FAFSA information (for fall admitted students only) to know who to invite to apply to IAP. We are concerned that many students will wait to submit the FAFSA and create an even narrower window in which to review applications and interview students. We are already working with a compressed timeline!

To get a jump start on the process, we invite your students to apply to the Incentive Awards Program **now!** Candidates who have already submitted the FAFSA should know whether or not they are Pell eligible. These students should definitely be directed to the application. It is "live" and can be accessed here using the password Cohort24, which is case sensitive.

In order for students to move through the application, they must first enter the name and contact information of their recommender. For this year only, we will allow recommenders to use the same letter they submitted to UMD for admission. Please know that we would prefer a letter tailored to IAP as they are a key part of the application.

We will still formally invite students to apply as FAFSA information is shared with the Office of Student Financial Aid. There will be rolling due dates according to when they are invited. Interviews will take place in mid-late March and may overlap with your district's spring break. Award notifications will be made on April 1. Learn more on the IAP website. 
