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Mobile app available

Common App for mobile provides the same secure, streamlined application experience as the Common App online, all from the convenience of a mobile device.

The mobile app seamlessly integrates with the desktop experience – allowing students to apply to college, research financial aid, and get advice from counselors – virtually anytime, anywhere.



Application fees should not prevent students from pursuing higher education.

Students with financial need can easily request a fee waiver in the application.

Examples of eligibility criteria:

- ACT/SAT fee waiver
- Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program
- Annual family income within eligibility guidelines
- Federal, state, or local program (e.g. AVID, GEAR UP, TRIO)
- Family receives public assistance
- Living in public housing, a foster home, or homeless
- Ward of the state or an orphan
- Can provide a supporting statement

Account rollover

The Common App launches on August 1 each year, but students don't have to wait until then.

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Navigating the first-year application

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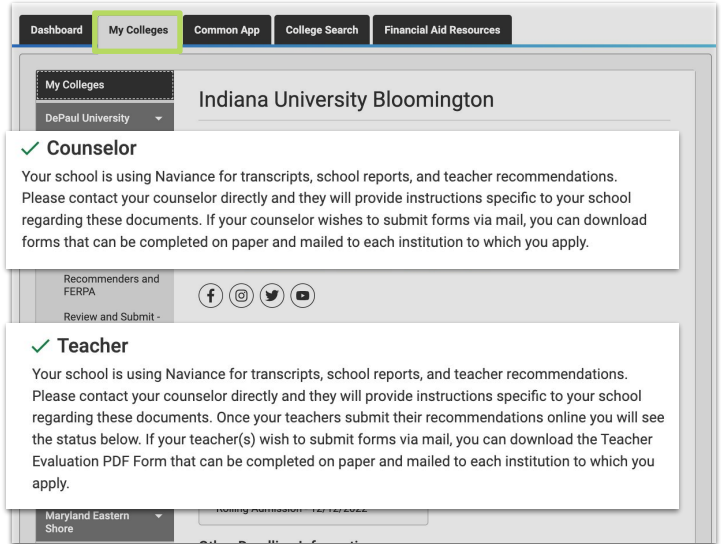
Navigating the application

My Colleges includes detailed information and requirements for each college on your list.

- Answer college-specific questions
- Complete the FERPA Release Authorization
- Invite and assign recommenders *
- Submit application
- Submit writing supplements, if applicable

When students attend a school using Naviance to submit school forms, their Common App will prevent them from inviting their counselor and teacher recommenders. **Students will do this in Naviance.**

You are still able to invite 'other recommenders' from your Common App account.



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Recommender types

Counselor

- Completes school forms and sends transcript
- Writes letter of recommendation (35% require)

Teacher

- No school requires more than 2
- Completes teacher evaluation and writes letter of recommendation (30% require)

Other recommender

- **Optional**
- Examples include
 - Arts teacher outside of school
 - Clergy
 - Coach
 - College access counselor
 - Employer
 - Family member
 - Peer
 - Other

Advisor

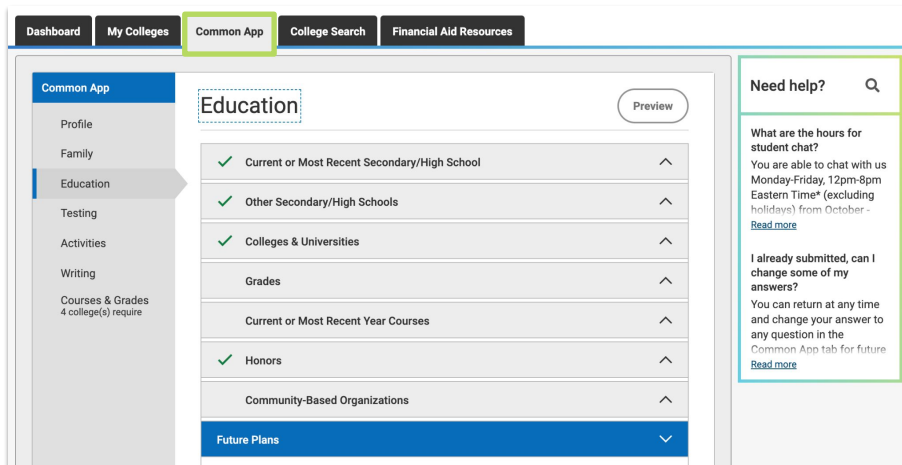
- **Optional**
- Students can invite up to 3 advisors
- Advisors do not submit any forms
- Can view student's completion progress and a PDF copy of their application (with permission)

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Navigating the first-year application

The Common App tab is where you complete the main sections of the application.

FAQs and links to Common App support provide assistance throughout the application.

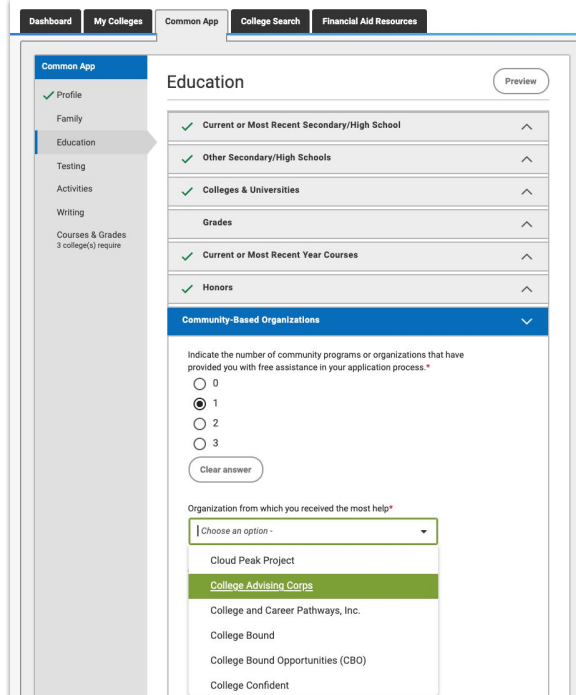


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Advising support

Students who have participated in a free college access program can let colleges know.

- You can report up to 3 Community-Based Organizations (CBOs)
- Examples:
 - ACES
 - AVID
 - Boy/Girl Scouts
 - College Bound
 - Collegiate Directions, Inc.
 - CollegeTracks - Montgomery County
 - POSSE
 - TRIO (Upward Bound, UBMS, Talent Search)
 - Other



Access to UStrive mentors

UStrive – formerly Strive for College – was started in 2015 as a way to virtually connect students to trained volunteer mentors in a safe and secure environment.

Since 2016, students who qualify for a Common App fee waiver have been invited to connect with a UStrive mentor in the first-year application.

Beginning August 2022, all first-year and transfer students have the option to connect with a UStrive mentor, regardless of fee waiver eligibility.

UStrive mentors help students:

- Apply to college
- Navigate the financial aid process
- Transition into college
- Get their degree
- Find a job after graduation

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Activities section

Reporting activities and experiences helps colleges better understand your life outside of the classroom.

- Report up to 10 activities
- Estimate the amount of time spent in each activity

Activities

Reporting activities can help colleges better understand your life outside of the classroom. Examples of activities might include:

- Arts or music
- Clubs
- Community engagement

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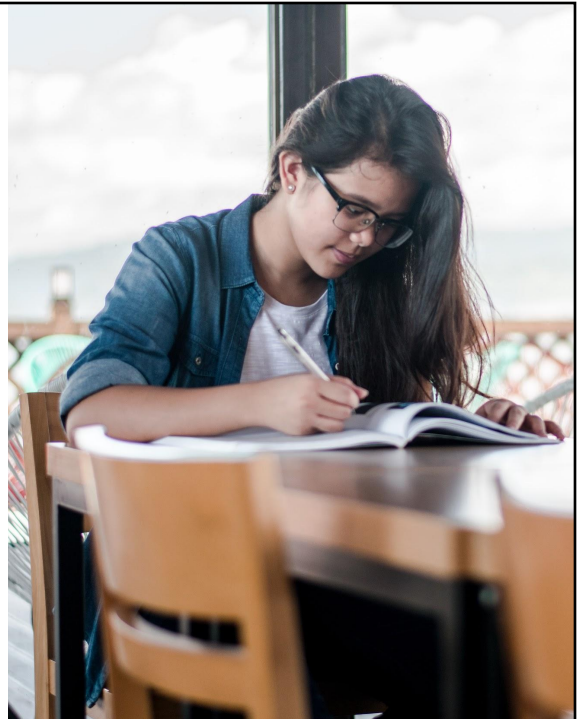
Community disruptions



Learn about financial aid

For many applicants, the most challenging part of the journey to college is the price tag. We're here to help you every step of the way! Here are some options that might work for you.

The federal government

The U.S. Department of Education awards about \$150 billion a year to more than 13 million students! They help students with federal grants, student loans, work study programs, and more. Explore the [different types of financial aid](#) and research what will work best for you.

To apply for federal aid, you must complete the [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The government uses this form to give money and help you fund your education. The online form is available starting October 1, 2022! Complete it as early as you can to ensure full eligibility.

Telling your story

How to approach the essay

The Common App essay instructions ask you what you want the readers of your application to know about you apart from courses, grades, and test scores. You have 7 prompts but endless possibilities to tell your story. Here are some ideas to inspire your thinking.

Think about

- Your community, environment, family, and culture
- What you're deeply curious about and how you spend your time
- What makes you proud
- People and experiences that have shaped your life

Ask yourself

- What's missing from the rest of my application?
- Is there context to help colleges understand who I am?

Think about

- All obstacles: big, small, personal, and societal
- Hardships faced by family or friends that also impacted you
- Unresolved challenges you're still struggling with

Ask yourself

- How did I cope? How did I grow?
- Who helped me?

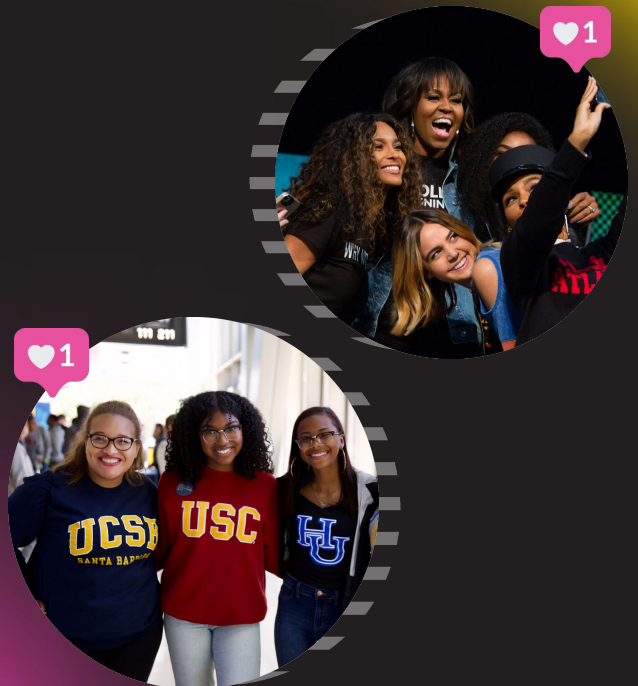
